The Edmonton Arts Council (EAC) is a not-for-profit organization with a mandate to support and promote the arts community in Edmonton. The EAC works to increase the profile and involvement of arts and culture in all aspects of community life. Our programs and services are designed to realize Connections & Exchanges: A 10-Year Plan to Transform Arts and Heritage In Edmonton.

Our Arts Development and Investments team provides advisory services that support the delivery of funding programs to individual artists, collectives and organizations. Their work provides responsive support to build capacity in the Edmonton arts ecosystem. Under the guidance of the Manager, ADI, and through the active engagement as a contributing member of the ADI team, the Program Advisor is responsible for supporting the work of the team which includes:

- Providing efficient program management, applicant support, facilitation of peer assessment processes, and internal reporting for the effective delivery of EAC investments.
- Presenting information about the funding programs the EAC offers both one-on-one as well as in a group setting.

- Acting as a key point of contact with the EAC for artists and arts organizations as they
 pursue their artistic and community engagement goals.
- Maintaining relationships with the artistic community through application assistance and sharing information about investment opportunities, in addition to making connections to other EAC programs and services.
- Maintaining lines of consistent and professional communication.

Team Success

- Actively supporting the team's cohesive delivery of programs while demonstrating the values and expectations of the team.
- Engaging with other teams who support the delivery of investment programs.
- Collaborating across the EAC to support and implement new initiatives, as directed.

Administration

- Effectively managing information through the online portal SmartSimple.
- Supporting the documentation of and actively following established program cycles.
